Created in 1991, the Greater Greenspoint Management District (GGD) is a key contributor in providing and advocating for improvements that benefit the Greenspoint/North Houston area. Security was foremost on the minds of GGD's creators, and in 1994, the organization's efforts led to the opening of The Greater Greenspoint Public Safety Center at Greenspoint Mall.

The 5,000 square-foot facility houses 45 officers and provides a centralized location for police activity in the community. The GGD recently created a 501 (c)(3), Greenspoint Community Partners, to gain support to sustain and enhance programs in the Greenspoint area, including the operations and programs of the Greenspoint Public Safety Center.

## Greenspoint Public Safety Center Highlights

The Center benefits the surrounding community by:

- Enhancing the ability for cooperative law enforcement activities
- Bringing law enforcement to the heart of Greenspoint, instead of operating from a beat station located 20 minutes away
- Adding approximately 1800 patrol hours each year
- Greatly contributing to Greenspoint having one of the fastest response times to "in progress" (Code 1) calls

## Service Area Snapshot

The Center primarily serves two area HPD beats, 6B50 and 6B60. Demographics for the neighborhoods within a three-mile

radius of the Center include:

- More than 4,000 businesses
- More than 63,000 employees
- 95,000 residents
- 63% of dwellings are renter-occupied
- 54% of the population is Hispanic or Latino

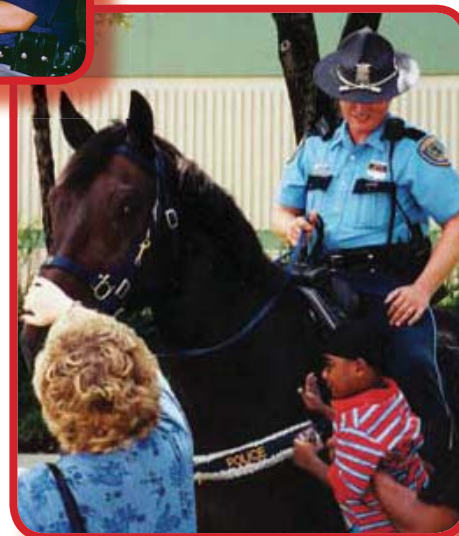
## Programs

The Center serves as a focal point for collaborative efforts between law enforcement and the community. Some of the community programs operating through the Center include:

**Operation "Greensweep"** – A partnership with the Houston Police Department that seeks to rid the area of drug-related activity and on average adds approximately 120 hours of police service each week.

**Auto Theft Task Force** – A special unit of Harris County deputies made possible by a grant from the Texas Auto Theft Prevention Authority. This program adds approximately 160 hours of police service each week and focuses on stopping auto theft through special police operations and public awareness.

**Contract and Off-Duty Patrol Activities** – A partnership between HPD, Harris County deputies, Aldine ISD police and METRO police. The program adds about 100 hours of police service each week and helps increase police visibility in the community.
